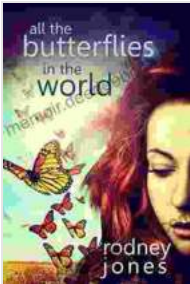


All the Butterflies in the World: John and Tess

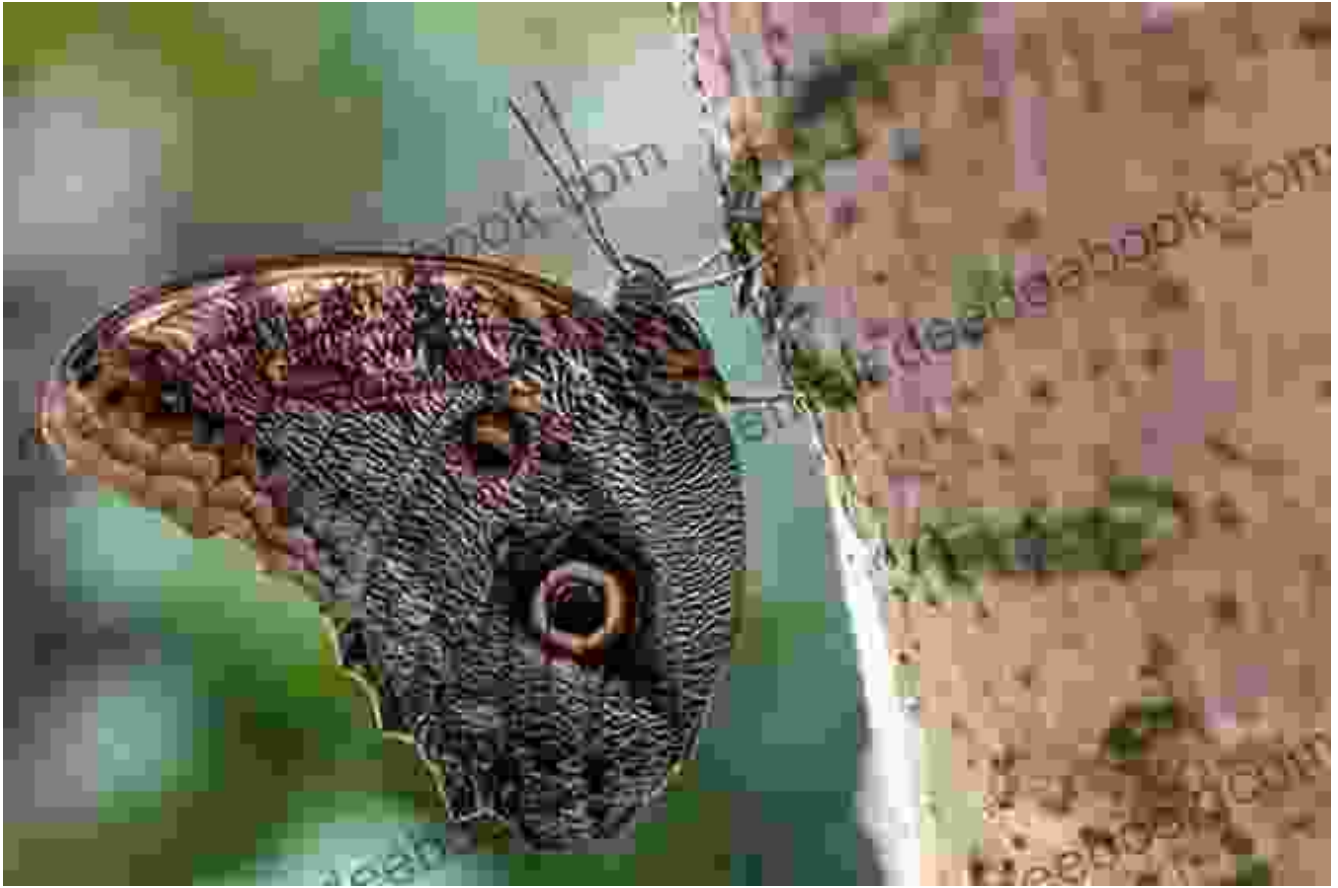

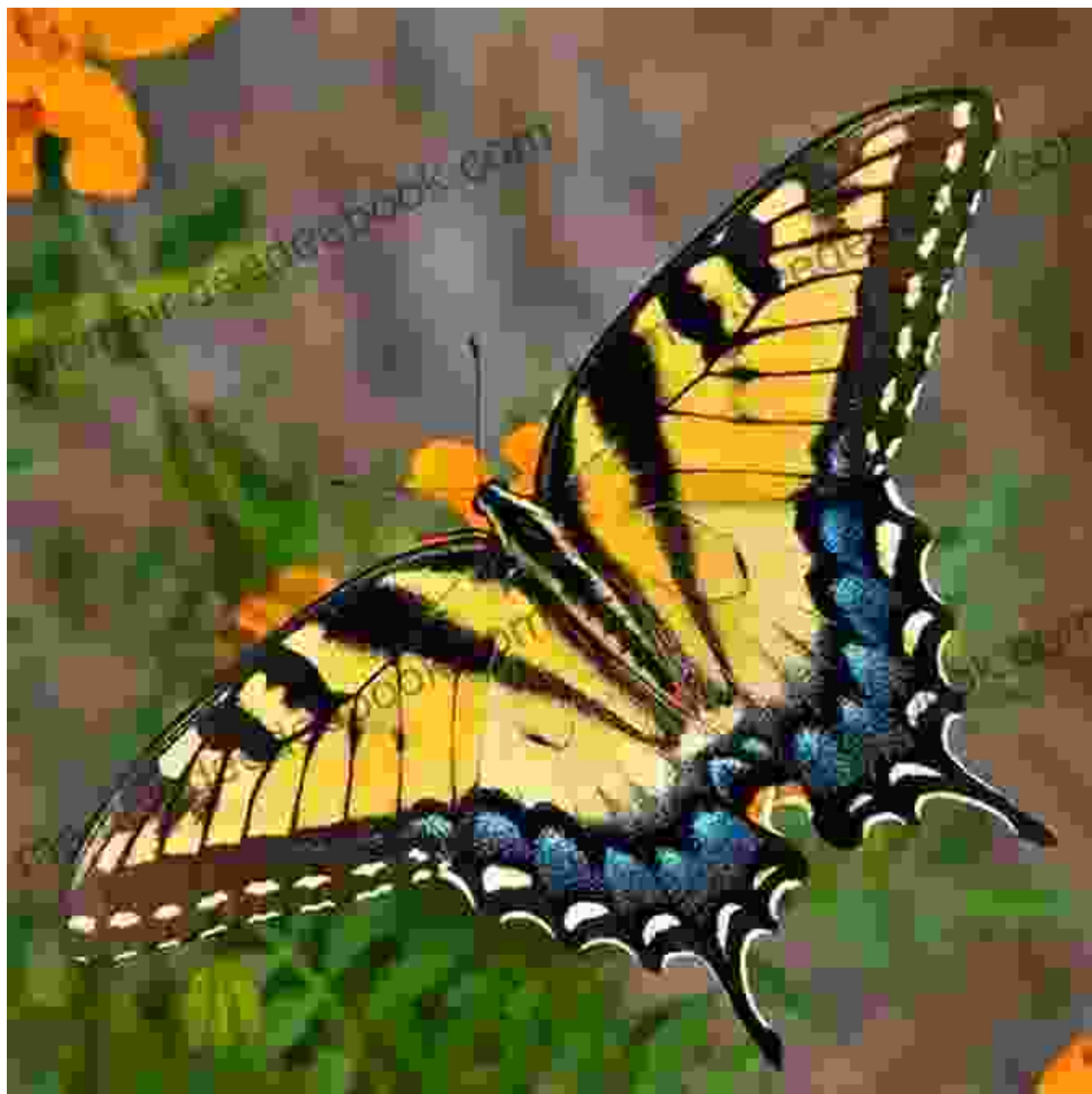

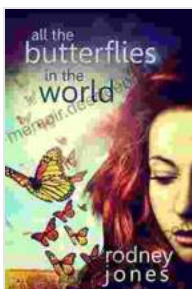
