- Lift the old stitch off the right-hand needle.
- Repeat steps 2-3 until only one stitch remains on the left-hand needle.
- Cut the yarn, leaving a 6-inch tail, and pull it through the last stitch to secure.

4. Weave in Loose Ends:

- Use a tapestry needle to weave in the loose ends of the yarn at the beginning and end of the dishcloth.
