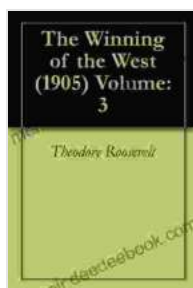

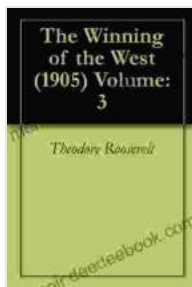
Frederick Remington
