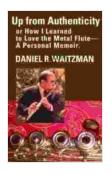
Up From Authenticity: Or How I Learned To Love The Metal Flute

Playing the metal flute has also taught me the importance of being authentic. I used to try to be someone I wasn't, but now I'm comfortable being myself.

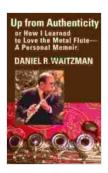
