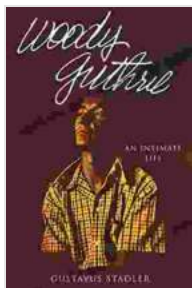


Woody Guthrie: An Intimate Life

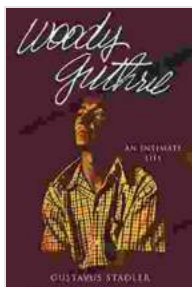
